- 3900-2500 B.C.E. Chalcolithic Age. Copper discovered – Kypros in Greek – Copper.
- 2500 1050 B.C.E. Bronze Age trading of copper
- Ruled by Greeks, Phoenicians, Assyrians, Egyptians, Persians, Romans, Byzantines, and even Richard the Lionheart and the Knights Templar

Modern History

- The 1878 Cyprus Convention Britain administration
- Turkey allied with Germany in WWI
- Britain annexed the island in 1914.
- Treaty of Lausanne in 1923, Turkey had to give up all rights to Cyprus.
- 1925 colony of Great Britain.

Trouble Brews


- 1930 Enosis union with Greece.
- Greek Cypriots remnants of the first Greek colonizers of Cyprus. Greek, Orthodox Christian majority
- Turkish Cypriots descendants of Turks/Ottomans. Turkish language, Islam 20% of the population.
- 1955-1959 Enosis versus ethnic division
- 1960 Republic of Cyprus disagreement on Constitution

1964 United Nations peace keepers fail





Summer 1974

- Coup to overthrow the leader of Cyprus.
- Replaced the leaders with those that were for Enosis.
- Turkey uses 1959
 Treaty of Guarantee to invade Cyprus.
- UN 40,000 troops on the north coast.
- Thousands injured, killed, or missing
- Thousands displaced



Today

- Green Line divides the island into northern and southern Cyprus.
- Republic of Cyprus 66% of the island Greek, South
- · Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC), North
- · UN buffer zone
- Pyla mixed village where Turkish and Greek Cypriots live together
- 2003 Opened border
- 2004 the referendum for unification was defeated
- Republic of Cyprus European Union, while the TRNC remains unrecognized by the United Nations.
