Warm-up (10 minutes)				
Task	 What is your favorite Musical instrument.? Do you play any instruments? Do you know any other instruments from another country? Step 1. Students will look at the different pictures of different musical instruments. They will share their favorite instruments with their partners. Step 2. Students will be introduced to some of the Arab musical instruments by looking at the chart. Step 3. Teacher will share with students about which country each instrument came from using the world map. Students will listen to different instruments (ex. Tablah, Kaman,) 			
Presentation (40 minutes)				
1. Grammar & Vocab (10 minutes)	 Teacher will display a big chart with the instruments' names and pictures. Students will use the chart to practice saying the instruments' names in three types of vocabularies (E, E/A, and A) Students will match the instruments' names with the correct pictures using work sheet 1. They will copy the instrument's name next to each picture. 			
2. Interaction (20 minutes) (teacher-facilitated, guided practice)	-The teacher and students will engage in a writing activity. Teacher will write three sentences on the board (E, E/A, and A) (sheet 3) - Teacher will guide students by giving them example: التي المفضلة هي الكمان






