- Is there a set amount or do you have to ask for money and explain your budget?

h. Comparative Borders and Migration Conference

Funds are requested in Year 2 for a conference organized in collaboration with the UA Center for Latin American Studies. Funds will support invitation of a Middle East studies expert on migration and refugee issues.

Detail: Speaker's professional services fee @ \$250; Roundtrip airfare @ \$450; Hotel @ 3 nights @ \$200/night=\$600; Per diem @ \$50 x 3 = \$150; ground transportation/parking @ \$50. Total: \$1,500.

i. North American Conference in Iranian Linguistics

Funds are requested in Year 1 to co-sponsor the above-named conference, which will be held in Tucson and benefit UA faculty and students of Persian language, and linguistics. UA faculty member Dr. Simin Karimi serves on the organizing committee. Total: \$500.

j. Arabic Linguistics Society Symposium

Funds are requested in Year 2 to co-sponsor the above-named conference, which will be held in Tucson and benefit UA faculty and students of Arabic language and linguistics. UA faculty member Dr. Mahmoud Azaz serves on the organizing committee, and is involving UA colleagues in planning. Total: \$1,000.

- Budget Narratives are often overlooked but very important
- Often, not always, the length of a budget narrative is not regulated as strictly as the narrative
- Allows more details than the narrative

- Zoom H5 Digital Recorder (\$269.99 each): High-quality audio recorders will allow me to collect clear data in interview sessions, interactional settings, and performances. Given that I will often be recording performances that may have more than one participant, my project requires two recorders as well as two sets of microphones and wireless transmitters. - 2. Sennheiser Wireless Bodypack Transmitters (\$629.99 each): This project necessitates the use of wireless transmitters and the Sennheiser Wireless Transmitters represent one of the most durable and moderately priced transmitter sets available. These transmitters consist of wireless body-packs that allow a lavalier microphone to be connected to the receiver, worn by the individual being recorded, with the audio signal being transferred wirelessly to the audio recorder. Budget Justification:

E2. Travel: International

The budget assumes a roundtrip flight from Tucson, AZ to Amman, Jordan at a cost of \$1474.00, with an intended start date of August 31st, 2018. This price was reached after comparison from flight aggregator websites including Kayak.com and Google Flights, and then confirmed with the United Airlines website.

The budget also includes \$26.50/day for lodging and utilities at the field site (\$26.50/day x 365 days = \$9672.50). This amount is based on the co-PI's previous experience conducting research in Jordan and living in Amman, current cost-of-living indexes from numbeo.com, as well as current market listings, which have risen dramatically in recent years as a result of the Syrian refugee crisis. Per diem meals and incidentals are budgeted at \$20/day (\$20/day x 365 days = \$7300.00). For both lodging/utilities and per diem meals and incidentals, costs are considerably lower than the U.S. State Department per diem rate for Amman. and are budgeted based on the co-PI's previous travel in the region, as well as advice from local contacts.
