Application for Funding

Funding Includes: (Note: This is a \$400 value.)

- hotel accommodation at the conference venue – Loew’s Ventana Canyon Resort – for 1 night (the night of Saturday, January 25) – FOR NON-TUCSON RESIDENTS ONLY!
- full-day registration for Saturday, January 25 and for the workshop on Sunday morning, January 26

Important Note:

This is a national-level conference, so when the University of Arizona pays your registration and hotel room, the costs are non-refundable. If you accept the funding and decide not to attend at the last minute, you will owe the university \$400, the pre-paid cost of your hotel and registration. (If you realize early on that you cannot attend, and we are able to find someone to take your place, then you will NOT be liable for the amount.)

How to Apply

1. Determine your eligibility.

You are eligible to apply for funding if you:

- are a community college instructor (full-time or adjunct) for whom the workshop is relevant to your teaching

- live/teach at least 60 miles from the University of Arizona campus
- do NOT plan to retire or leave teaching within the next year or two
- teach regularly – Adjunct Faculty ARE eligible but need to explain in the essay (below) how often and how many courses they teach.
- will attend the ENTIRE conference
- Agree to attend the full-day on Saturday and the workshop on Sunday morning

2. What to submit.

- the short application cover page (with your basic information on it)
- a short (1 page) essay including what/where you teach and how this workshop will benefit you and your students.

3. Email the application.
